Conditions of entry 2021

The 2021 Chiltern Art Prize is back after COVID forced it's cancellation in 2020. The prize is open to all Australian artists. There is a total prize pool of \$5000. Artist's may submit up to three works.

The Chiltern Art Prize of \$1500 will be awarded to the most outstanding work on display. All works are eligible for this prize. Additional prizes are awarded in the following categories:

Section A: Two dimensional works - prize \$1000, may include, but not limited to:

- Painting (any medium, any subject)
- Works on paper (any medium, any subject)
- All works must be framed and wired securely for hanging. Unframed canvas stretchers are acceptable
- Works must not exceed 1.2m x 1.2m (including frame)

Section B: Three dimensional works - prize \$1000, may include but not limited to:

- Textiles, ceramics, metalwork or woodwork, stone, carvings or clay sculpting, jewellery and/or wearable art
- Works must be assembled and ready for display with stands or plinths to be supplied by the exhibitor where necessary
- Works must not exceed 1.2m x 1.2m or weigh over 15kgs.

Section C: Photography - prize \$1000 may include digital or traditional photographic methods:

- Works must be framed and securely wired for hanging
- Works must not exceed 1.2m x 1.2m (including frame).

Section D: Youth award (under 18) \$500, any style, any medium:

- Artists must be under 18 years of age as of Friday 11 June 2021.
- All works must be framed and wired securely for hanging. Unframed canvas stretchers are acceptable
- Works must not exceed 1.2m x 1.2m (including frame.

Conditions of entry 2021

- For categories A-C, up to three works may be entered with an entry fee of \$10 per work
- For category D (under 18) entry fee is \$5 per work
- All work must be presented ready for display, clearly labelled with Name, Contact, Title and Price of work on the back
- Suitable display equipment for 3 dimensional work is to be provided by the artist. Please be mindful that your work will be moved by volunteers so if your work is very heavy or hard to handle you may be asked to assist.
- Entries must be the original work of the exhibitor, completed in the last two years and not previously exhibited in the Chiltern Art Prize
- All works will be presented for sale to the public at the price stated on the entry form and may be photographed by organisers and local media for promotional purposes
- Organisers reserve the right not to hang work if deemed unsuitable or not appropriately presented for display. This includes unframed/poorly framed or inappropriately strung works
- Fully completed entry forms and exhibition fees must be received by 3pm Friday 28 May 2021
- Late entries will not be catalogued.
- Chris Brown is offering 30% framing for all entries that require it. Please contact Chris Brown, Frame & Art, on 0417 550 076 or at 6 Darling Street, Chiltern 3683.
- The Chiltern Memorial Hall will be open to receive works on Thursday June 10 between 9am and 5pm. Please make arrangements for your work to be delivered during this time. Freight deliveries of artwork can also be made during this time.
- Personal collection of unsold works must be from the Chiltern Memorial Hall on Monday June 14 between 4pm and 6pm or Tuesday June 15 between 9am and 5pm. UNCOLLECTED WORK CANNOT BE STORED. Please adhere to delivery and collection times as any uncollected works will be disposed of at the discretion of the organisers.
- Transport for delivery or collection of artwork and any insurance costs are the responsibility of the artist. All possible care is taken with your work but the organisers accept no liability for lost or damaged works.
- A commission of 20% will be retained by the organisers on all work sold. The balance will be forwarded to the artist by cheque or EFT within 14 days.
